Introduction

This booklet is published by the Missouri State Highway Patrol as an aid to persons who are interested in recreational boating crashes and accidental drowning incidents occurring in the state. It contains information which provides a comprehensive look at statewide crashes and accidental drowning incidents as experienced in 2021.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol is the central recreational boating data collection agency for the State of Missouri. The Patrol investigates all recreational boating crashes occurring in the state and either investigates or gathers data on accidental drowning incidents occurring in state and private waters.

Interesting Statistics

Here at a glance are some interesting statistics found in this booklet:

- *In 2021 there were 28 persons killed and 122 persons injured in recreational boating crashes in the state of Missouri. This was 14 more killed and 14 more injured than in 2020. There was a decrease of 4% in total crashes statewide (195) compared to 2020 (203).*
- *In 2021 there were 195 total crashes including 93 property damage only, 74 injury, and 28 fatal.*
- *“Failed to keep proper lookout” was the leading contributing circumstance for all crashes followed by “water conditions (rough, chop, current, etc.)” “Impairment (alcohol/drugs)” was known to have been a contributing circumstance to ten crashes statewide.*
- *“Inexperience of the operator” crashes resulted in the deaths of two persons. This was 7.1% of the total persons killed in crashes.*
- *Of all crashes reported statewide, 81% (158) occurred during the months of May through August.*
- *Most crashes occurred on Saturday (74) and Sunday (42) and most (137) occurred between noon and 8:00 p.m.*
- *Of all crashes reported statewide, 64.6% (126) involved only one watercraft. Twenty-seven of the twenty-eight fatal crashes involved only one watercraft.*
- *Of the 234 boat operators involved in crashes, 133 had no prior boater education.*
- *In 2021, there were 46 persons killed in accidental drowning incidents occurring in state waters, nine more than in 2020. The Missouri State Highway Patrol also investigated 10 accidental drowning incidents that occurred on private property and an additional five that were flood/other related.*
- *Most drowning incidents occurred on Friday (14) and Saturday (11) and most occurred during the months of June (13) and July (16).*

It is hoped that the information in this booklet will be of value to you. Certainly it is the most comprehensive look available at statewide crashes and accidental drowning incidents in Missouri.

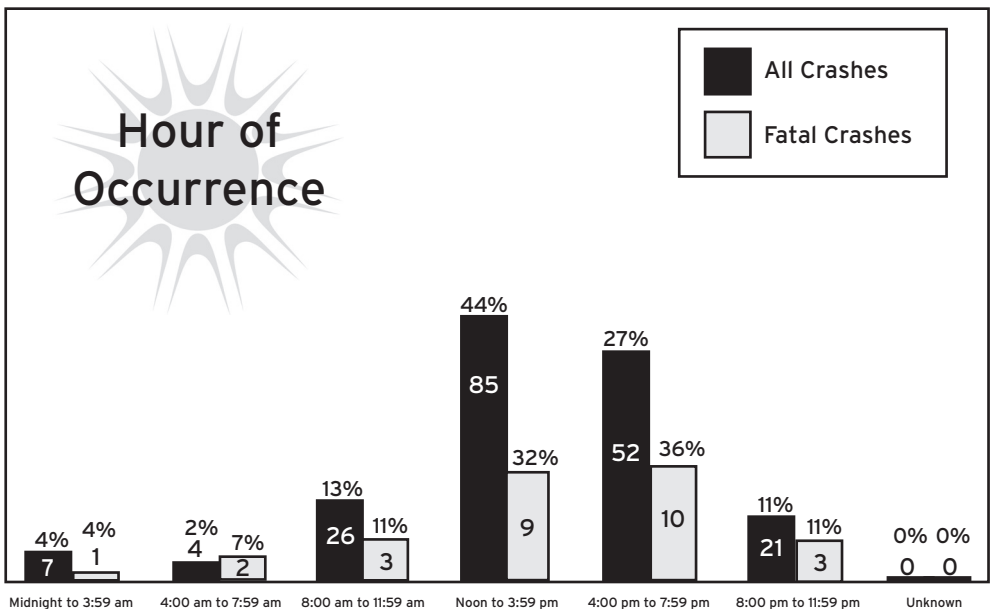
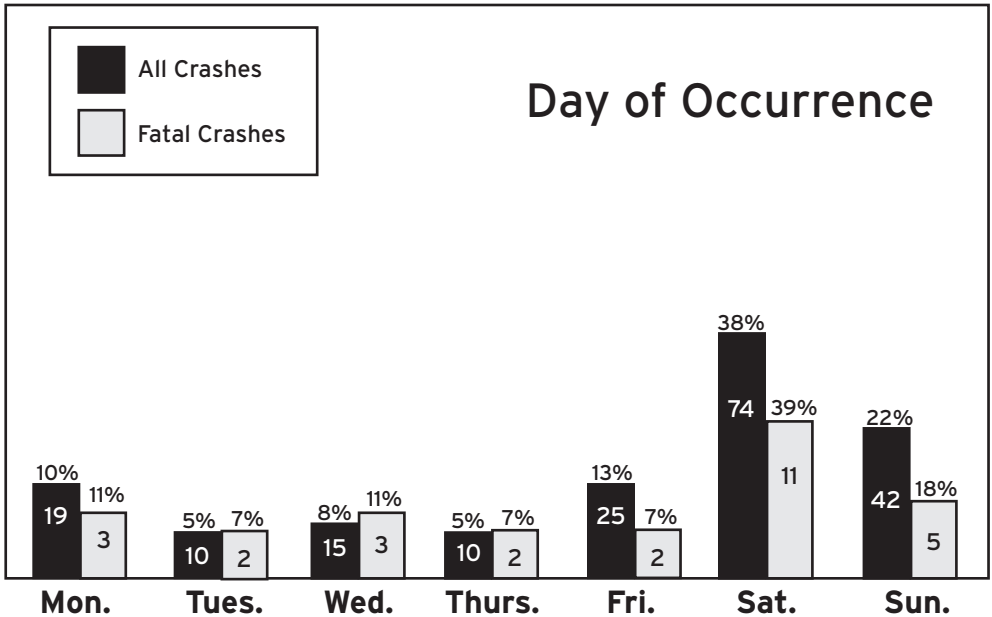

Crashes by Day and Hour



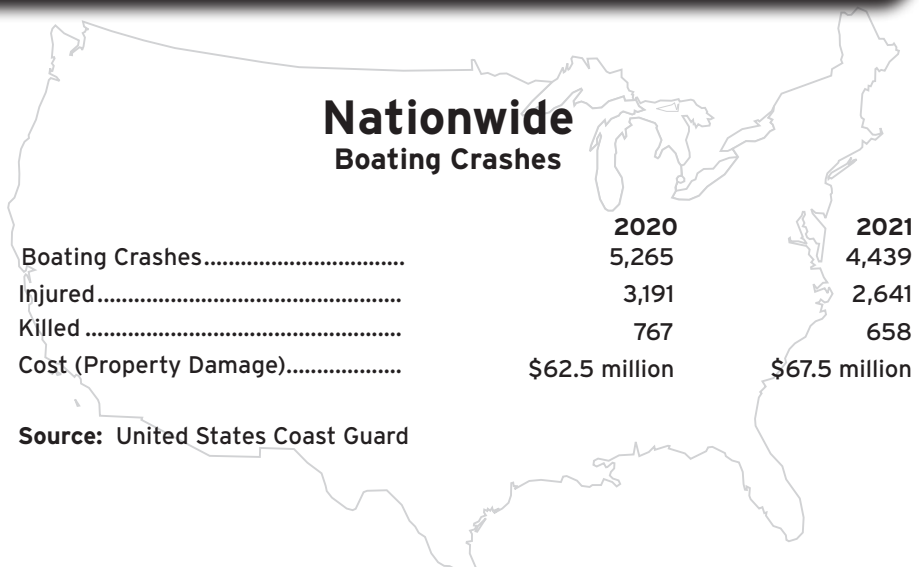

Alcohol Involvement

Drinking and Crashes - Whether or not a person has been drinking cannot always be determined at the scene of a crash. Because of the time lapse from the moment of occurrence until an officer arrives at the scene to make the investigation, a person's condition concerning drinking can change a great deal. In cases where the individual may have been removed to a hospital, doctor's office or funeral home, his/her condition may never be determined.

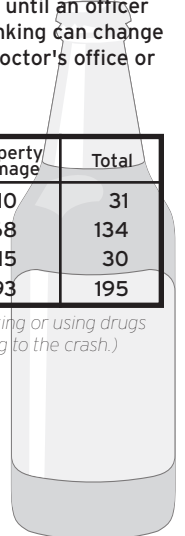

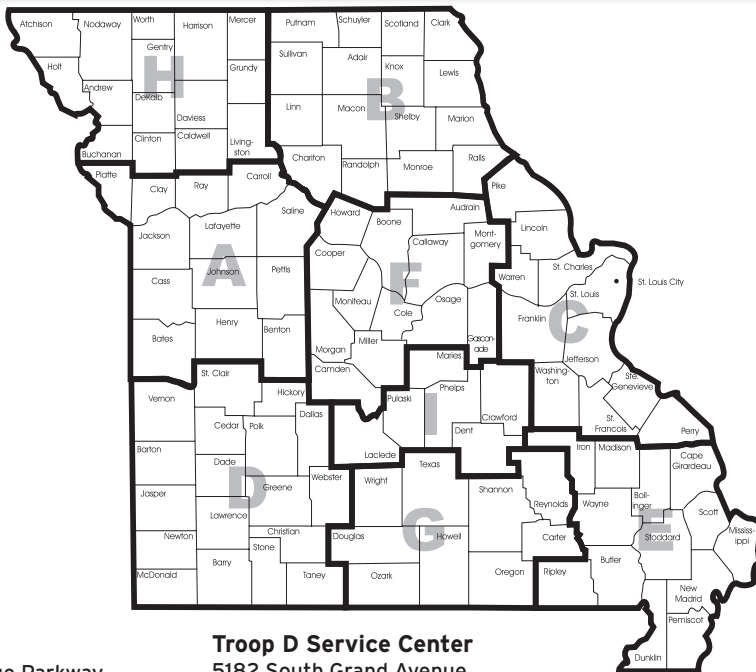
